The dean and the Executive Committee of the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts, with the endorsement of the School of Public Health, are pleased to recommend the reappointment of John A. Doe as chair, Department of Afroamerican and African Studies, College of Literature, Science, and the Arts, effective July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2027.

John A. Doe received his Bachelor of Science from Michigan State University in 1966, his Master of Arts from the University of Toledo in 1970, and his Doctorate from Wayne State University in 1972.

Professor Doe joined the faculty at the University of Michigan in 1971 as an assistant professor and was promoted through the ranks to professor in 1986. He was appointed as the Daniel Katz Collegiate Professor in 1994, and has held the Daniel Katz Distinguished University Professor of Psychology since 1995. He also holds an appointment as a faculty associate in the Institute of Gerontology. Professor Doe was the interim director of CAAS from 1998 to 2000 when he was appointed as the chair.

Professor Doe has been an invaluable asset to the department. His efforts to strengthen faculty partnerships with other departments and to recruit new people have resulted in an outstanding faculty. He also led efforts to update the undergraduate curriculum and develop an academic minor. Current plans include a multilevel graduate program that will offer professional certification, as well as interdisciplinary masters and doctoral programs.

We are very pleased to recommend the reappointment of John A. Doe as chair, Department of Afroamerican and African Studies, College of Literature, Science, and the Arts, effective July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2027.
