

AWARD HISTORY

The James T. Neubacher Award was instituted in October of 1990 by the University of Michigan's Council for Disability Concerns (CFDC), as a memorial to Jim Neubacher, an alumnus of the university who was a columnist for The Detroit Free Press and an effective advocate for equal rights and opportunities for people with disabilities. The Council selected the month of October for the presentation of the James T. Neubacher Award as a highlight of the university's Disability Community Month event series.

This is the 31st year in which the University of Michigan has sponsored educational programs and events designed to increase awareness of important disability issues and promote a greater recognition of the skills and talents which people with disabilities contribute to the university and the greater society.

2020 JAMES T. NEUBACHER AWARD RECIPIENT

CHRISTA A. MORAN, Michigan Medicine

As the co-lead of the Michigan Medicine Disability Resource Group, Christa A. Moran is a staunch and fierce advocate for our disability community. While her primary work is with patients who are deaf or hard of hearing, Christa tirelessly uplifts all aspects of the disability community. Christa has worked on several initiatives in partnership with the Office for Health Equity and Inclusion and the Michigan Medicine Disability Resource group. And she has led efforts to support patient care during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Christa supported a medical student run initiative at the University of Michigan Medical School training U- M undergraduates, as medical interpreters for Spanish speaking patients. This initiative, CLIMB, is aimed at improving the health outcomes of Spanish-speaking patients as well as creating opportunities for students underrepresented in medicine, or students interested in addressing health disparities, an opportunity to gain clinical experience.

Another example of Christa's fierce advocacy is leading the effort to create a MiChart Disability Tab. This new MiChart feature expands the ability for patients to notify the healthcare team of accommodations prior to entering the health system. This is a transformative advancement for patient experience.

Dr. Michelle Meade wrote in her nomination, "In my opinion, Christa is one of the superheroes living among us and she should be celebrated and recognized for her hard work and spirit of inclusion!"
