Guess the Zoom Virtual Background

The game is played by you or people on your team switching between different movie/TV shows or video game Zoom Backgrounds and having your colleagues guess the background by put their answers in the chat or shout them out. Whoever guesses correctly first, wins that round. This can be a fun way to begin or end a meeting.

Instructions for Adding Zoom Backgrounds

1. Find the picture you wish to add as your background by doing a google search for it. For example, type in, "Stranger Things zoom background or Movie zoom backgrounds."
2. Once you find the desired picture place your cursor over the picture, right click and select "save image as..." Save the image as whatever you'd like but replace the *.webp* with *.jpg*.
3. Go in to the folder or location that you saved the image and open it up.
4. Click on "Edit & Create" drag down to click on "Edit."
5. Click on "Save a copy."
6. Chose a location to save it and be sure the file name ends in *.jpg*
7. Go into Zoom
8. On the lower left side of your screen click on the ↑ next to "Stop Video."
9. Click on "Choose Virtual Background."
10. Click on the "+" key to add image or video
11. Add the image and click on it to make it your new zoom background.
12. Now plan a time to play the game with your team!

Fun with Kahoot!

Kahoot! is a game-based learning platform that brings engagement and fun to 1+ billion players every year at school, at work, and at home. You can sign up for free!

Instructions for Kahoot!

1. Go to <https://kahoot.com>
2. Click on upper right corner "sign up" or "log in" button.
3. Pick a Kahoot you would like to facilitate with your group or create your own. (e.g. Quiz regarding facts about your program or dept.; could be on a specific topic like nutrition, etc.)
4. When the group is assembled (via zoom or even face to face) share your kahoot screen with the Game PIN and login instructions.

5. Add participants by having them use laptop, iPad, smart phone and follow instructions from your screen by going to www.kahoot.it and typing in the applicable Game PIN.
6. Once all participants appear on the facilitator's screen, click start.
7. Participants will pick correct responses to each question presented.
8. Facilitator clicks next on their device until the kahoot is complete.
9. Kahoot will then announce the person who won the game!

Pictionary Using Zoom Whiteboard

Instructions for Pictionary

1. Facilitator sends a direct message (via zoom chat) to the volunteer "Drawer" stating the item they are tasked with drawing.
2. Facilitator then shares the whiteboard on zoom. This is accessed by clicking on the Share Screen button the bottom of your Zoom Meeting window. Then click on Whiteboard and hit Share.
3. The "Drawer" then opens the Annotate toolbar. (This is done by selecting "View Option" from the top of the Zoom window, and then choose Annotate. A toolbar appears with all your options for annotating, including text, draw, arrow, etc.)
4. The "Drawer" attempts to draw the item sent to them in the private chat.
5. The teams or individual participants can type their guess in the chat or even state it aloud over zoom.

Two Truths and Lie

Instructions for "Two Truths and a Lie"

1. Facilitator asks for volunteers prior to the meeting to share two truths and one lie about themselves. It is recommended that the two truths selected is something they don't mind being shared with their colleagues.
2. The Facilitator then uses the Kahoot app or other means to create a quiz based on the Two Truths and a Lie shared from the volunteers.
3. During the meeting, the Facilitator shares the quiz and gets the team to guess which is the lie for each of the volunteers.
4. Once the correct answers are shared, allow time for each volunteer to elaborate on the Two Truths they shared. This is the MOST important aspect of the game. By allowing, your colleagues to share about their truths, it can foster deeper connections.

Scavenger Hunt

Instructions for "Scavenger Hunt"

1. Facilitator picks a topic in advance for the meeting. Some topics ideas could involve: grab your favorite hat or find an item with special meaning near you; find your favorite kitchen tool, etc.

2. During the meeting, the facilitator asks their team to go get an item near them that relates to the topic. Facilitator allows 1 minute for folks to search for the item.
3. The team shares the various items they brought on camera.
4. The facilitator allows a few people to share the item they found and why they selected it. The sharing is the most important aspect of the activity.
